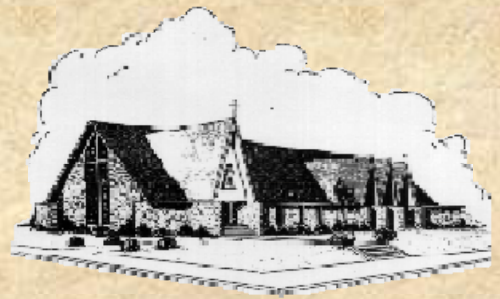

Sacraments of Initiation

Adults or school aged children inquiring about the Faith, for the reception of *Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist, and for Reception into Full Communion of the Catholic Church*, please call Marianna Rossi .

Baptism of Children is celebrated on Sundays at 1:30 pm. Please call the Parish Office to make necessary arrangements. Interviews prior to the reception of the Sacrament are conducted by Marianna Rossi for first-time parents.

Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation: The *Rite of Reconciliation* is celebrated on Saturdays from 8:30 AM to 9:30 AM and from 4:00 PM to 5:00 pm, and by appointment.

Sacrament of Marriage Couples are encouraged to contact the Parish Office soon after their engagement to meet with one of the Parish Priests. It is recommended that a date is set with the Church before a date is set with a reception hall. The Archdiocese of Philadelphia requires that couples make arrangements for the Wedding no less than six months prior to the planned date of marriage. Either the bride or the groom must be a registered member of Our Lady of Good Counsel Parish for the Wedding to be scheduled. Know Before You Go:

We strongly encourage use of public transportation. Private vehicles will not be permitted in Center City Philadelphia during the Papal Visit (Saturday, September 26 & Sunday, September 27). Please continue to visit the World Meeting of Families website at www.worldmeeting2015.org for transportation updates and sign up to receive the Papal Visit Playbook, a guide to navigate Center City during the Papal events.

Transportation to Papal Mass on Ben Franklin Parkway

The Papal Mass is scheduled to begin at 4:00 p.m. For those in our parish who wish to attend the Papal Mass, SEPTA is running express trains into Center City from Warminster Station. Warminster Station is the only boarding location on this line. There are no other stops until Center City. Please note, there is no guarantee that you will get on the first available train, though SEPTA has indicated that it will have additional cars to facilitate this process. Attendees must understand that, at this time, no specific Center City stops have been announced. There may be a several mile walk to the Parkway. SEPTA is offering special passes for regional rail. It is only these passes that will be acceptable to gain access to a train.

The special passes must be purchased in advance. No tickets will be sold on the train. Quantities for sale will be limited to the number of riders SEPTA can accommodate on each train car. Please visit the SEPTA website at www.septa.org for the train schedule and fares.
