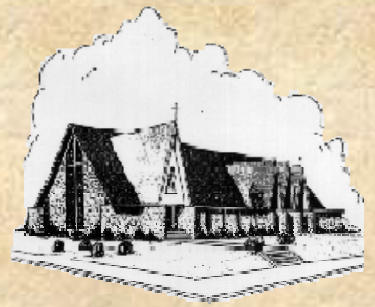

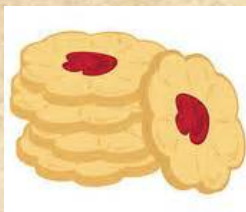

Sacraments of Initiation

Baptism of Children is celebrated on Sundays at 1:30 PM. All baptisms must be scheduled in advance. Please call the parish office to make the necessary arrangements.

Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation: The *Rite of Reconciliation* is celebrated on Saturdays from 8:30 AM to 9:30 AM and from 4:00 PM to 5:00 pm, and by appointment.

Sacrament of Marriage Couples are encouraged to contact the Parish Office soon after their engagement to meet with one of the Parish Priests. It is recommended that a date is set with the Church before a date is set with a reception hall. The Archdiocese of Philadelphia requires that couples make arrangements for the Wedding no less than six months prior to the planned date of marriage. Either the bride or the groom must be a registered member of Our Lady of Good Counsel Parish for the Wedding to be scheduled. What is the Pastoral Council? - It is the vision and planning body of the Parish, and is advisory in nature. It carries out this task in collaboration and cooperation with the Pastor, who has the final say in all matters. It does not deal with finances. The members need to be rooted in prayer, open to the guidance of the Holy spirit, committed on a by monthly basis to patient listening, study and working to recommend to the Pastor plans and direction which will enhance the quality of Parish life and promote Parish vitality.

Who is eligible? – For a parishioner to be given nomination consideration, he/she should:

- ◆ Be a baptized, practicing Catholic.
- ◆ Be a registered member of the Parish for at least three years.
- ◆ Be a participant in the ongoing life of the Parish, especially Sunday Eucharist.
- ◆ Be at least 18 years of age.
- ◆ Have a desire for spiritual growth in oneself and the Parish
- ◆ A willingness to listen to the needs of the parishioners, to speak honestly and to work toward consensus.
- ◆ Have the ability to inspire and empower others and to delegate.
- ◆ Have an availability of time and energy.

How and When? - The nomination process will begin October 10th, 2015 and conclude October 18th, 2015. Please fill out the nomination form attached and place in the collection basket or in the designated box in the back of church. Election will take place 11/21st & 22nd – 11/28th & 29th.

Question (Deacon) Mark

Why doesn't the Catholic Church allow other Christians to receive communion when they visit us for weddings and funerals? If we go to their religious services, they allow everyone to receive.

The word communion in and of itself provides the fundamental reason as to why we do not offer the Eucharist to non-Catholic Christians. By partaking of this sacrament, we not only profess belief in Christ's real presence (which many of our separated brothers and sisters do not acknowledge), but also our commitment to this essential part of the Creed: that we are called to be one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. During the Last Supper, Jesus prayed that his followers would be one, just as he and the Father are one (John 17:21). That is what communion is all about: when we receive the Body and Blood of Christ, we not only come into union with our Lord, but also with the other members of his Church. Throughout the history of salvation, God called his people into communion with him not merely as individuals, but as a community. God redeemed Israel by bringing them out of Egypt as a unified nation; he assembled them at the foot of Mount Sinai to receive the Law (Exodus 19:17); they gathered together for the dedication of Solomon's Temple (1 Kings 8:2); they assembled after the Exile for the dedication of the restored temple (Ezra 6:21). In Jesus' time on Earth, the Jews came together for the great feasts such as Passover and Pentecost, in addition to assembling weekly at their synagogues – a tradition that was immediately carried over into the Christian Church.

The importance of unity for Christianity cannot be overstated. As history has amply pointed out, there is strength in numbers, and we are easily defeated when we try to go it alone. When Christians have separated themselves from the Catholic Church, they have almost invariably fallen into heresy, losing some important aspect of the fullness of faith that often multiplies with the passing of time. Our separated brothers and sisters have not only lost the comfort of Christ's real presence in the Eucharist, but many of their congregations have rejected ancient Church teachings regarding critical moral issues, at times embracing the mainstream culture's viewpoint on issues such as divorce, human sexuality, contraception, abortion and euthanasia. Without the leadership provided by the Vicar of Christ, many Christians have strayed far from the fundamental teachings of the faith. Our recent popes have made extraordinary efforts to reach out to the leaders of non-Catholic denominations in an effort to bring our fragmented Church back together. Until such time as we are again one Body of Christ, we cannot take communion together, for by doing so, we would be celebrating a unity that does not yet exist. As we are reminded before the distribution of Holy Communion at liturgies such as weddings and funerals, we are all to pray constantly for the eventual unification of the Church, so that as Christ desired, we may truly be one with him and one another.
